It's been a fantastically busy few weeks, culminating in a wonderful "Art, Craft and Food Show," coordinated by the Parent and Teacher Association on Queen's Birthday weekend. This was a gargantuan effort from all involved in the weeks leading up to our major fundraiser. The day was a huge success with the weather gods playing their part by keeping the showers at bay, and large crowds turned out to enjoy all the diverse art, craft and delicious food on offer. Many, many thanks must go out to all the students, staff, parents and whanau who offered up their help and support both prior and during the day itself. The money raised will go towards purchasing new furniture and equipment for our library, which is being resurrected some time in Term 3, and will be enjoyed by students for generations to come.

On the building front, our new four class development, at the far end of school, is taking shape nicely and is due to be completed by the end of this term. The Year 3 and 4 students will be moving into these spaces and it will be exciting to see them use this new learning space. We are hopeful that the new build will be ready for us to start moving furniture and resources into these spaces during the last week of the term. This is the reason we have arranged a Teacher Only Day on the final day of term to allow the staff some time to prepare these class spaces for Term 3. We will be having an official "Dawn Ceremony" to bless the building on one of the mornings during the last week, and we will give more details about this ceremony when we know more about it.

The new build will certainly improve our teaching and learning conditions; however, we will still need to keep the relocatable classrooms (9, 10, 14 and 15) due to our ever growing roll. I have had ongoing meetings with the Ministry of Education and a Feasibility Study has been conducted on the school, the results of which will recommend further classroom developments. We look forward to clarification from the Ministry of Education about future building projects at Parua Bay School, and when I receive this information I will pass this onto you.

The next whole school event is the annual school cross country run in two weeks' time on 22 June. I look forward to seeing you cheer the children along at this wonderful event.

Parua Bay School X Country 2017



Our annual X Country event is being held here at school on Thursday 22nd June (week 8) (pp: Monday 26th June). Please refer below for times, and reverse for a map of the course.

We hope to see as many parents along as in previous years to support the kids at this exciting event. If you are able to spare some time, we may be able to use a few parents to help marshal around the course to help ensure children's safety. Please talk to your child's classroom teacher if you are able to help.

As with previous years, children will be running in age groups, according to their age as at the 1^{st} January this year. They will be told which race number they will be participating in.

Races are: 1 - 7 according to their age (see approximate times below). This means that most children will run with children in their <u>year level</u>, but there will be a few exceptions. Please see your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions about this.

As a result of our school event, we will be selecting children (aged 8 to 12+ years at 1^{st} of January) to represent our school in the WPSSA Cross Country Championships. This event is being held later in term three. Selected children will be given all information in term three.

The main purpose of this event is fun and participation, especially for junior children. However, there is a competitive element to it with a number of children vying for a place in our team to compete at the WPSSA event. The "Hayes Family Cup" and 10000 whanau points are also up for grabs for the Whanau with the best overall results. Please send your child to school with a change of clothes as children will get muddy!


Approximate Race Times

We will endeavour to keep to these times as closely as possible.

9:00am	Children will assemble on the bottom court – judging of best dressed whanau.
9:30am	Race 1 (11 &12+ year olds) - boys then girls a few minutes apart
9:40 am	Race 2 (10 year olds) - boys then girls a few minutes apart
9:50am	Race 3 (9 year olds) - boys then girls a few minutes apart
10:00am	Race 4 (8 year olds) - boys then girls a few minutes apart
10:10am	Race 5 (7 year olds) - boys then girls a few minutes apart
10:20am	Race 6 (6 year olds) - boys then girls a few minutes apart
10:30am	Race 7 (4 & 5 year olds) - boys then girls a few minutes apart

PARUA BAY SCHOOL BOARD REPORT Tuesday 16 May 2017

The board met Tuesday 16 May & with a full agenda I offer this update as an outline of reports & policies reviewed.

Hazel Smith provided the Board with detailed reports for both the Priority Learners & the Accelerated Learning Programme for Term 1 - the reports provided baseline data & analysis for reading, writing & mathematics for the Priority Learners outlining the % of students well below, below, at or above National Standard & the reading levels at both the beginning and end of term 1 for the cohort of ACE students, the levels progressed, strategies, reflections & next steps. The use of the Quick 60 reading programme has reportedly been successful across all levels that it was used in as has the ACE programme on a whole in regards to accelerating the success of the students involved.

The policy for review this month was Reporting to the Board, some changes were made to wording of the document for implementation.

Our treasurer Kathy Faulkner summarised her meeting with Education Services & was pleased to report we are tracking well financially - Danny & Kathy will complete a budget review at the end of June.

James Buckland provided an update in regards to the Enrolment Scheme, letters were received from both Onerahi & Whangarei Heads Primary providing feedback as part of the consultation process; James will reply to both school boards clarifying the points that were raised & will notify the Ministry of Education of our request to implement the zone as described.

We were provided with a self-review report for the Keeping Ourselves Safe programme that took place in weeks 8-11 in Term 1; the review outlined what went well, what didn't go well, how we can improve & the voices of both the students & community - lots of great feedback & areas that could improve the programme for the future.

The principal's report provided the board with updates on the PBS 2017 annual goals & actions being taken to achieve these - along with updates regarding curriculum & learning programmes, forth coming events, personnel & employment, finance, property, maintenance & development.

Lastly Tangiwai Baker has taken on the responsibility for facilitating the bi-annual community survey (with my support); keep an eye out for the survey - parental & community feedback is invaluable in this process.
