Welcome back to Term 3 at Parua Bay School - I trust you all had a relaxing and enjoyable break over the holidays and that your children are fully refreshed, ready to get entrenched in their learning. The end of last term was a frenzied whirlwind of excitement and activity; sporting activities, meetings, visiting speakers, kapa haka, the new building opening and lots of furniture and resource removals. Certainly, the staff all deserved their well-earned break.

It is absolutely wonderful to have the new building, Te Akonga, open for instruction and learning this term. The opening ceremony was a huge success with upwards of about 100 parents, students, staff and community in attendance. The school is looking fabulous and I would like to thank Alec Cooper, our caretaker, for all his fantastic efforts over the holidays to ensure that the environment is not only clean and tidy but also safe for your children. Building work continues during the first 5 weeks of this term on the creation of a new staff area, along with an area for our teacher aides and students with special needs. It is great to witness these "Modern Learning Environments" coming to fruition at Parua Bay School, and I look forward to seeing students and staff enjoying these "collaborative spaces" this term. Please remember that Parua Bay School operates an "open door" policy, whereby you can come and experience the teaching and learning for yourself. It would be helpful if you communicated this intention to your child's classroom teacher, but when you're at school, teachers are only too happy to receive your help or support also.

On Wednesday 26 July, at 9.00 a.m., we are holding our termly powhiri in the hall for all students and staff new to Parua Bay School since the last powhiri at the start of Term 2. This is a wonderful ceremony and all parents and family members are cordially invited to attend this special occasion. There will be tea, coffee and biscuits for parents in the staffroom after the ceremony.

During this term there will be an opportunity for parents and community to give feedback to the school on a variety of issues, via 2 community surveys. The Health Community Consultation survey, created by Ange Vette, Deputy Principal, will go out this term and addresses typical "Health Curriculum" issues. The school community survey, administered by the Board of Trustees, also goes out later this term, and allows parents the opportunity to feedback their opinions on issues like curriculum, teaching and learning, communication, leadership and procedures. Please take the time to fill out these important surveys as it is an important part of our self-review cycle.

Finally, it is "Book Week" at school next week with some exciting activities organised for the children by the teachers. I look forward to seeing you around school at events and assemblies throughout the term.

BOT REPORT

The board met on 27th June and discussed a range of items. Unfortunately we have had Staci Paul resign as a BOT member due to conflict of interest with her new role at Ministry of Education. Thanks for your input Staci and best wishes for the new role. The board had the option to replace by a byelection or replacement by selection and voted to replace by selectionwatch this space for updates.

Approval was given to commence painting of the school, commencing during the holidays with completion by start of Term 1 next year. It will be great to give the school a well-deserved makeover. Development of a junior playground was discussed and it was agreed to engage Nature Play NZ to assist in developing concepts and budgets for the project. Nature Play designed the Ngunguru School playground so have a look if you are heading past.

The community survey was also on the agenda, and as part of this it was decided that prior to the survey information will be provided to parents regarding the Tikanga Maori/Te Reo component of the curriculum, to be sent out during Term 3.

The Principal's Report included a number of items including the attendance report (we are around the national average for attendance figures), staffing, and room allocations following the completion of the new block. The BOT is awaiting a feasibility study from Opus regarding options for managing the future roll growth over the next few years.
