### Be Safe, Be Seen - Slow Down

There are long term plans afoot with the Ministry of Education and the local council to solve traffic congestion problems at Parua Bay School. These problems are evident every day at 2.45 p.m. when buses, cars, parents and pedestrians all converge towards the front gates of Parua Bay School. This plan will hopefully give us a safer bus transportation route, more car parking options for parents and staff of the school, the Kindergarten and the Play Centre and a safe pedestrian walkway from the school to various exit and parking points. However, this plan is still very much in its infancy; so it is imperative that all parents heed the following safety advice:

- Drive with exceptional care around the school vicinity
- Don't walk through the staff car park
- Children must not cross the road without an adult
- If parking opposite the school, please walk with your child back to your car.
- Please don't park in the Kindergarten or Play Centre car parks, unless using them to drop off children.
- Please encourage your children to be safe at all times at the end of the school day
- Please leave service station access free.

# Board of Trustees Report February 2017

James Buckland has been re-elected unopposed as Chairperson of Parua Bay School Board of Trustees for 2017. After Christian Reynold's resignation from the board last year, we welcome Helen Smith who has been selected as the Staff Representative on the board.

#### **Enrolment Scheme**

The initial draft zone was considered in our December meeting and suggestion was made that the zone be widened. A revised draft has now included the suggested expansion and Danny Jewell and James Buckland have driven the proposed boundaries to ensure they are clearly identifiable. The board confirmed that the new draft is acceptable and we will now write to the Ministry for approval to begin the process of consultation with our community.

#### Annual Report 2016

The principal's Annual Report covered the implementation of collaborative teaching and learning processes at PBS. It also noted the excellent progress made towards our Maths goal of '80% of all students to achieve at/above National Standards for Mathematics'. We came very close to achieving this goal with 79.5%, representing a substantial increase of 6.5% on 2015's results. For Writing, we achieved 76.4% students at/ above National Standards. For Reading, 78.2% of students achieved at/above National Standards. The report also included the steps made to provide a differentiated model of education that will cater for all students at PBS. These included Accelerated programmes, and identification of Gifted and Talented students and Priority Learners.

#### Charter 2017

During the School holidays the board met to review and accept the 2017 Charter. Our

2017 Annual Plan Goals are:

- To reduce the gap between boys' and girls' achievement levels in writing
- To build capacity amongst all teachers to teach Te Reo Maori within the classroom
- To consolidate further collaborative teaching and learning practices at PBS, effectively utilising flexible learning spaces

In summary, our school's strategic goals for 2017 are:

- Improve achievement levels for all students through collaborative teaching and learning practices
- Enhance Te Reo and Tikanga Maori engagement within PBS and the wider community
- Reduce PBS environmental footprint
- Effectively manage roll growth at PBS

#### Roll Growth and Future Needs

The board has written to the Minister of Education outlining our frustrations with the slow progress with our new classrooms and our concerns for safety regarding the current parking and bus turning areas. We have also asked for more assistance for the next phase of building work, and that they will provide more urgent support in response to our rapid roll growth.

Currently, it is hoped that the four new classrooms will be operational by term 3. This will mean that we will have a library again.

#### Principal's Report

Danny outlined a new approach for this year with Action Teams involving all teachers in one of four key areas. Staff will analyse and monitor progress in the following areas:

- Boy's Writing
- Collaborative Teaching and Learning practices
- Environment (This will include a focus on our playgrounds, especially the establishment of a junior playground area)
- Production

Hazel Smith has commenced Accelerated Learning with selected groups of students this term. The aim of these groups is to expedite the learning of these students so that they are achieving "At" the National Standard for that particular area. There will be accelerated groups for reading, writing and mathematics. Priority Learners who are achieving below the National Standard at reading, writing or mathematics will be also identified in each class and be monitored closely.

The next Board meeting is on Tuesday 4 April.

## School Karakia

Last week we gave you a translation of our school Karakia that we were lucky enough to have written for us by one of our parents. This week we wanted to let you know a little more about the meaning.

#### Haruru ana te tai a Ihu waka,

The tides rumble at Ihu waka.

Ihu waka (the nose of the waka) is the furthermost point at Taiharuru. There is a huge cavity at the very point. Legend says Ihu Waka is a sacred place of Te Waiariki. It is a place that our taniwha, the giant Stingray dwells. He only comes out to fore warn the tribe of invading hostilities, or if there are events in the tribe that are not good. When he does come out, he causes the whole place to shudder and rumble to let everyone know that he is getting ready to pay a visit.

This is about acknowledging that there will be times in the student's school journey where they may encounter some difficult learning situations.

#### Marino ana te tai i roto,

The tide within the waka and estuary is calm. This is saying that although learning at school can be tricky, the waters are calm, and the teachers are supportive.

#### Ko te te kina te mango te patiki,nga kai o nga rangatira

The kina the shark and the flounder are the food of champions. This compares children to champions, thriving on the food of knowledge.

*Taiki e!* Yes unanimously




