Kia ora koutou whanau

I trust you all had a relaxing break over the Easter period and your children are ready to get stuck into the busy life of school again. I would like to thank all the staff and students for their exceptional contributions into making the last week of last term such a wonderfully positive time. The whanau academic competitions in the hall proved to be exciting and challenging events, the "Caring Kind" afternoon was a huge success, with numerous differing activities being organised by teachers for the benefit of our community, and finally the Anzac Service was a respectful occasion where our students acquitted themselves with dignity in this formal time of remembrance.

You will have noticed the increase in construction and infrastructure work happening at school over the holidays. The new four classroom development is scheduled to be completed by the end of this term, and we are very much looking forward to our Years 3 and 4 students moving into this wonderful learning environment as soon as it is ready. However, the intention for all "relocated" classrooms (Rooms 9, 10, 14 and 15) to be taken away to free up some more space around the school will be put on hold. The exceptional roll growth the school has experienced over the past three years has meant that these classrooms will be remaining in order for the school to be able to function properly. The Board of Trustees and I are in negotiation with the Ministry of Education over the possibility of a further building programme, which may result in the school receiving more new classrooms. A Feasibility Study is currently being prepared to give to the Ministry of Education, upon which decisions for further classrooms will be made.

In the meantime, the Library will be used for its original purpose (as a classroom), when in Term 3 it will be able to be claimed back as a library. There are also plans to create a better space for the staff using Room 13 and the adjoining reading resource room. A meeting was held last term between staff and a representative, Anna, from Nature Playground, and from this we will be planning to design and build a junior playground using natural resources. This project will incorporate the students' and community ideas and will aim to use local resources and manpower once the brief has been designed and determined.

Junior and senior assemblies are taking place in the hall every fortnight on even numbered weeks - seniors on Wednesday afternoons at 2.00 p.m. and juniors on Friday mornings at 9.00 a.m. There will be a powhiri ceremony / assembly for all our new students and staff this Friday 5 May at 9.00 a.m. in the hall and you are welcome to attend this event. Other events to look forward to this term are the annual Arts 'n Crafts Show on Queen's Birthday weekend (Monday 5 June) and the Literacy Support evening for parents and students on Monday 12 June at 6.00 p.m.

I look forward to seeing you at school during the term.

#### Northland Primary Schools Swimming Championships.

These swimmers swam superbly well throughout the day and recorded some very impressive times and performances. The following results reflected a wonderful day of swimming prowess:

Jayden Stokes Under 12 Boys - 5th Freestyle, 8th Backstroke.

Ellinor Whittam Under 10 Girls - 1st Medley, 1st Breaststroke, 4th Butterfly, 6th Freestyle,

8th Backstroke.

Ella Grindle Under 10 Girls - 2nd Butterfly, 2nd Medley, 2nd Breaststroke, 2nd

Backstroke, 9th Freestyle.

Joshua Laing Under 9 Boys - 3rd Medley, 3rd Freestyle, 4th Backstroke,

5th Breaststroke.

Ruby Lewis O'Shea Under 9 Girls - 2nd Medley, 3rd Freestyle, 3rd Backstroke, 3rd

Breaststroke, 3rd Butterfly.

Records were broken all afternoon in a very high level of competitive swimming. Ellinor Whittam set two new records for 25m Breaststroke - 21.87 beating the previous best of 23.71, and for the Individual Medley she swam 1:11.19 beating the previous record of 1:14 .85. It is interesting to note that Ella Grindle's 2nd placed swim in both these events also beat the previous records by some margin too. A fantastic day of achievement and fun was experienced by all the swimmers - my congratulations go out to them all for a wonderful day.

## Mouthguards




Are you or your child playing rugby or hockey this season?
