As the days begin to lengthen and the sun's rays start to re-invigorate us into action, the staff and students continue to work hard and play hard at Parua Bay School. Term 3 is historically a time for students to really consolidate their learning; new concepts taught at the start of the year begin to make sense, and now is the best time for our tamariki to practise this new found knowledge so that it is embedded.

Although there are some extra-curricular activities and events that happen during Term 3 (mainly senior orientated - A.I.M.s Games, debating teams, top level cross country) generally, there are less distractions at this time of year which gives staff and students the opportunity to really focus on their teaching and learning. I look forward to seeing these genuine learning contexts as I make my classroom visits every Thursday around the school.

Last week was "Reading Week" and the Book Fair, which was held in Room 9 throughout the week, was a huge success. Parents, students and staff purchased \$3,500 of books from the Fair, which, in return, rewarded the school with about \$1000 worth of books for our library. This is amazing news and I would like to thank Whaea Deanna for her part in co-ordinating this Fair. During the week, opportunities were organised for students to excel at and enjoy their reading, and I would like to thank Mrs. Aarsen for her part in organising this array of activities. The Book Character Day was one of these activities that proved to be very popular and extremely successful. Students and staff dressed up as their favourite book characters for the day, and this culminated in a book Character Parade in the Hall at the end of the day.

Part of my Springboard Trust Principals' Professional Learning and Development this year centres on Strategic Planning, with a particular focus on "Re-Visioning". This P.L.D. is very timely; Parua Bay School is running exceptionally smoothly with some wonderful processes and programmes in place. However, I feel it is now time to change the vision of the school, in consultation with the students, staff and parents of this community. The process has begun this term for the staff and we will be consulting the Community in Term 4 with regards to a Vision Statement, a Motto, an emblem, our School Values, Strategic Planning and curriculum content. I look forward to a genuine consultation process with a view to making our school even greater.


Te Reo & Tikanga Maori at Parua Bay School

Weekly Content:

Throughout each class in the school each day starts with a karakia (this can be a positive proclamation), followed by a song and then a mihi (personal introduction) by a few children. The process helps us come together, settle ourselves and focus. From week 5 this term, Whaea Rai will be teaching one Maori language (Te Reo) lesson per week for 30 minutes with each class, which is reinforced later in the week by the classroom teacher. A song session (whole school Waiata) completes the weekly Maori content on a Thursday afternoon. This means that each class will receive up to 3 hours per week of Te Reo instruction, or 12% of teaching hours.

Major Focus: Te Reo/Identity is our 'major focus' in 2017. In previous years this has involved an expo, but this year the focus has been on a sustainable foundation for teaching Maori language throughout the school, with all staff doing weekly Maori language professional learning development in staff meetings. The staff has completed 2 booklets out of four of a Tikanga / Te Reo Level 3 Course, which has been undertaken during staff meetings. One of the school's Annual Goals promotes upskilling staff in Te Reo and Tikanga Maori, so that they can feel more confident to deliver a classroom Te Reo programme

Bilingual Class: In 2018, with continued demand, Whaea Rai's class will have 12-30% Te Reo instruction (including what's happening school-wide). With support, there is scope to extend this offer to other syndicates going forward.





Mumps Update

Mumps has arrived in Northland. We had our first locally-acquired cases this week. More are likely. As you will probably be aware, Auckland is currently experiencing several notifications of mumps per day. Mumps is also present in some Pacific Islands, especially Fiji and Tonga. Most cases in Auckland are in the 10-30 year age-group; the situation is likely to be similar here.

Mumps typically presents with fever and parotid swelling (swelling around lower jaw and upper neck). Two doses of MMR vaccine are 85% effective, so cases can still occur in fully immunised people. Those with mumps are most infectious from 2 days before the onset of swelling until 5 days after.

MMR vaccine is free to anyone who needs it. If you or your child has not had two doses of mumps containing vaccine (MMR), or you are not sure, please contact your doctor for further information and catch up dose(s) if necessary. The vaccine is not given in pregnancy or in women who may become pregnant in the next four weeks.
