Kia ora koutou, Dear Parents and Whānau,

Last week a number of our intermediate students participated in a **debating competition** held amongst local schools, hosted in Whangārei. Well done to our team of highly driven debaters. A special thanks to Mr Jones and parent volunteers for helping to organise the day and provide support and transport. Qualifying senior students also entered the **Northland Science Fair** with notable results. See write up from Mr Jones below:

Fantastic Debating results - 4 wins from 6 debates. Outstanding first up effort from our 2 year 7 teams. Isabella Malcolm, Chloe Harrison, Gracie William, Sylvie Hermans and Georgia Baker.

Central North Science Fair, Forum North - 3 prize winners - Alistair Waelen, Georgia Baker and Jake Shepperd - actual prizes/placing are yet to be confirmed.

On Monday this week students also attended the 'Lit Quiz' in Kerikeri, an event aimed at developing literary talent and interest - we had 2 teams which enjoyed the bookish excitement of the event, playing against a wide catchment of teams throughout Northland. A special mention goes to Cael Bernecker, Cameron Scott, Alistair Waelen, Evalani Tuato'o and Isabella Malcolm, who apparently came 4th in a hotly contested round. Thank you to our parent helpers.

Teams for the annual **Mathex competition** from Years 5 to 8 battled it out at Whangarei Boys' High School on Thursday afternoon and evening. Thank you to parents for transporting students, we are highly dependent on your help with such activities. Each year group from Parua Bay had between 2 to 4 teams competing with over 40 other teams in each event. Well done to all students who participated, particularly to Unai, Dunixi, Sonny and Finlay - who came second in the Year 6 competition.

Every Tuesday we have a group of approximately 18 students participating in a new **Aquabots programme** - where students problem solve and create submersible buggies capable of being controlled and manoeuvred to achieve certain tasks. A huge thank you to Gareth Bodle and Adrianne Hermans for getting this initiative off the ground. It is great to see such a high level of engagement from the students and the involvement of the parents supporting and supervising the teams. We have also had a hugely generous donation from Bunnings towards the Aquabots team - see Adrianne's note in this newsletter.

We had a large contingent of **top runners from Year 4 to Year 8 who took part in the Barge Park WPSSA Cross Country competition** on Wednesday this week. As well as schools from across Whangārei there was also stiff competition from the Kerikeri cluster of schools. Cross Country is always a tough and gritty competition, I was very pleased to see the huge efforts made by all our students, often running in races with between 80 - 100+ competitors. Of particular note: Mabel Eilering placed 3rd in the 8 year old girls (ages at Jan 2022); Toby Harrison placed 3rd in the 9 year old boys; Bo Baker came 2nd in the 10 year old girls; Kaylee Earl came 1st in the 11 year old girls; Jade Marris placed 3rd in the 12 year old girls - outstanding results. Thank you to Mr Brent and parents for helping make attendance at the event possible.

<u>AIMS Games</u> is drawing closer, students and parents will be heading to Tauranga this weekend to join young people from all over Aotearoa New Zealand to compete at the highest levels in the intermediate age group. A huge amount of time and planning has been put into the preparations for our students by Mr Hamilton and our parent coaches/supervisors. I am sure this will be an awesome experience for our rangatahi.

When students take part in competitions, being able to represent Parua Bay School and being easily identifiable are benefits of wearing the school sports tops. **Thank you to all parents who have commented on the sports tee survey to gauge parental opinions** around having a required (or uniform) top for sporting events and for optional use day-to-day in school.
