Spring is a time for change, and there are plenty of opportunities to have your voice heard on a couple of topical issues at present. A survey about the future of the traditional library building has been e-mailed out to all parents of the school and is also available for members of the community to fill out at the gas station or at the office. Please take the time to fill out this survey; it will only take a few minutes and we need to hear the community voice in order for the Board of Trustees to make the appropriate decision. Please be assured that no decisions have been entertained as yet, and that the purpose of this survey is to ascertain the community opinion about the future plans for the school. Please read later in the newsletter about the building development proposed by the Ministry of Education for Parua Bay School over the next few years. This will arm you with the information you will need to complete the survey.

Another survey I would urge you to complete is the Council's proposal for a playing field survey. This was e-mailed out to all parents last week. Our preferred option would be for the Council to develop Ministry of Education land into a playing field area neighbouring the school. This would be beneficial to both the students of the school during the school day and also to the members of the community after school hours.

Recently, we have had some fabulous achievements by our students in cross country and the Science Fair. This has been written about later in the newsletter, but I would like to congratulate all students involved in these events I also wish the 11 students going to the Northland Schools Cross Country all the very best for their races in a couple of weeks. A host of Year 7/8 students travel down to Tauranga next week to compete in the A.I.M.s Games for Parua Bay School in a range of different sports; squash, cross country, gymnastics, hockey and netball. There are high expectations for these students and we wish them all the very best of luck in their sporting endeavours next week.

The P.T.A. organised a fantastic school disco last week which was very well attended by our students. It was a fabulous evening and I would like to thank all the parents and teachers who devoted their time and energy to making this such a successful event. A reminder that the P.T.A. will be meeting this Thursday 6th September at 6.00 p.m. at the Parua Bay Tavern - we are always looking for new faces to join in the fun.

Finally, the Parua Bay School Production, "Time after Time", is happening in the last week of this term. The classes involved (Years 4-8) have been practising hard and this will be a thoroughly entertaining and memorable evening. PROPOSED BUILDING DEVELOPMENTS FOR PARUA BAY SCHOOL

The Ministry of Education is currently planning with the Principal and Board of Trustees for a staged building project which is likely to include the construction of 8 classrooms (double storey), a new library, an administration block and a car parking area. Unfortunately, because these plans are still only initial stages, the Ministry of Education will not allow the Board of Trustees to share any designs or drawings of these plans. The reason for this is that these plans often change and the M.O.E. cannot commit to these plans at this early stage.

Planned Programme (unconfirmed):

- 1. This staged project will begin by constructing a double storey block of 8 classrooms, with a library attached, on the field following the same line as the new Te Akonga classroom block currently.
- 2. Once this has been built, classrooms 5-8 will be taken off site and the area vacated will be "made good" into playing space.
- 3. Classrooms 9 and 10 will be removed off site.
- 4. The next stage of the project will be the administration block and car parking area.
- 5. Dependant on the "library survey" results and financial implications, either:
 - the current library / staff room building will be developed into an upgraded administration block utilising the existing building

or

- the current library / staff room building will be removed / relocated and replaced by a new administration block that could be connected to a future 4 classroom block.
- 6. Once the administration block has been upgraded or re-developed, the current administration block and Room 11 will be removed.
- 7. The area vacated by removing the current administration block and Room 11 will be made into a car parking area and drop off area.

Future Development:

There are plans in this design stage for future expansion if the roll of the school continues to grow. A further four classroom block could be located between the administration block and Te Akonga (where Room 9 and playground currently is). Classrooms 1- 4 could also be replaced with modern classrooms.

Students will need help getting ready so if you are available please contact your child's teachers. All help will be gratefully accepted.


We still require help with set and painting etc so if you are available please let us know. Thank you for the efforts to help so far and for assisting with costume construction and design.


