
MINOR INCIDENTS

Type of Problem Behaviour	Definition	
Disruption	Student engages in intermittent but inappropriate disruption. e.g. calling out, off task.	
Inappropriate language	Student engages in intermittent use of inappropriate language.	
Inappropriate Physical Contact & Physical Aggression	Student engages in non-serious but inappropriate physical contact. e.g. rough play, impulsive touching.	
Property misuse	Student misuses property in a minor way, e.g. borrowing pens and not returning them, mis using class equipment	
Technology violation	Student engages in inappropriate use of music, video, camera or computer. eg, games Using devices without supervision at break times o after school.	
Other	Student engages in any other minor behaviour that does not fall within the above categories.	


Consider age appropriate behaviour and context

Have a class system of encouraging positive behaviour as well as consequences for incidents- share with the kids.

MODERATE INCIDENTS		
Type of Problem Behaviour	Definition	
Disruption	Student causes an interruption in class activity: sustained loud talk, yelling, noise using materials, rough play.	
Abusive or inappropriate language	Student uses other language.	
Defiance, disrespect, non-compliance	Student refuses to follow directions, talks back, and/or is socially rude in interactions.	
Property Misuse	Intentionally damaging other students stationary or classroom equipment.	
Technology Violation	Ongoing inappropriate use of technology after being spoken to e.g. break times or after school.	
Fighting, physical aggression (low level) e.g. deliberate pushing, play fighting that becomes mildly aggressive.	Student participates aggressively in a 'low level' incident involving physical aggression / contact.	
Other, including not completing consequence actions for 'Minor' incidents.	Student engages in any other minor behaviour that does not fall within the above categories.	
	or repeated MODERATE incidents leading to MAJOR. starting point and consider age of the child.	



MAJOR INCIDENTS

Type of Problem Behaviour	Definition	
Abusive or inappropriate language, profanity at student or adult	Student swears, name calls or uses other offensive language directed toward a student or adult.	
Harassment / bullying	Student gives disrespectful comments, posts, notes, pictures, sustained or intense verbal attacks, threats, unwanted physical contact and/or intimidation.	
Theft	Student in possession of someone else's property, has passed it on, is responsible for removing it without the owner's permission.	
Fighting, physical aggression (high level)	Student instigates or perpetuates an incident involving physical violence that results in, or has the potential to result in, serious injury or danger to others. Intimidation of other students - moderate between one off or repeated	
Running away from supervision	Student leaves direct or indirect supervision without permission from a member of staff.	
Technology violation	Student makes highly inappropriate use of music player, video, camera or computer, e.g. viewing or promoting violent, sexual or adult themed materials.	
Out of bounds	Student has left the school grounds without permission or direct supervision.	
Property damage or vandalism	Student intentionally engages in actions that result in serious damage.	
Use/possession of alcohol/cigarettes/vape	Student is in possession or uses cigarettes, alcohol or vape. Parent / teacher/ Principal meet.	
Use/possession of drugs or weapons	Student is in possession of or using drugs or weapons. Parent / teacher/ Principal meet + Police contacted as appropriate.	
Other, including not completing consequence actions for 'MODERATE' incidents.	Student engages in any other 'MAJOR' behaviour that does not fall within the above categories.
