The design in this hoe is linked to the patiki (flounder) that is in our karakia. The triangles represent the patiki. They live together in groups on the ocean floor and this hoe represents the relationships they have within these groups.

The triangle design in this hoe are shark teeth, which represent strength. This design for respect as mango (shark) is in our karakia and they demand respect. There is also strength in being respectful.

- I can recognise my feelings and work through any issues

Design Meaning

This design represents the kina in our karakia. Kina have the swirl design and are resilient as they are pushed and pulled by the tides against the rocks. The kōru represents the tides moving this resilient kaimoana.

Design Meaning

The koru design here represents the tides in our karakia. The tides are responsible for many aspects of ocean life. We can always rely on the tides to flow consistently.
