#### **Participation**

All ākonga will be supported to participate fully in this activity. Please let us know if your child has any needs that we are unaware of. We will work with you to put in place a plan to support a successful and inclusive experience for them.

Alan Clarkson, from the Cruising Club will lead the event, along with the support of his team and the school teachers. They will identify any hazards and manage the risks according to the school's safety management plan. This includes checking the weather prior/during the activity, doing a recce, checking equipment prior to

commencing and ensuring it fits properly, monitoring students experience/capabilities, and putting management strategies in place as required. The risks at this event include sunburn/dehydration, drowning, hypothermia, and while they can be maintained to acceptable levels, they cannot be totally eliminated. If you wish to see our safety management systems or have any questions, feel free to contact one of the lead teachers.

It is important for safety reasons that ākonga follow instructions given to them by all staff and follow all school rules. They will be supported to do this, however behaviour by ākonga that is deemed dangerous and puts themselves and/or others at undue risk will result in **being returned to school**.
